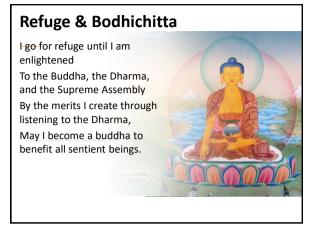

wheel of Dharma for living beings. I dedicate my own and other's

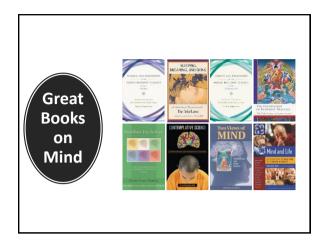
merits to the great enlightenment.

- Where is it now?

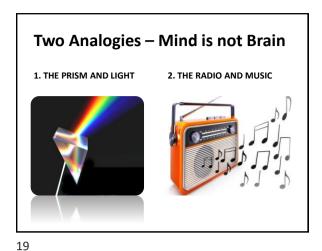

Every time a feeling appears, ask

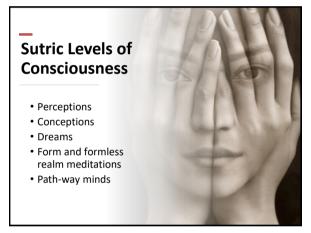

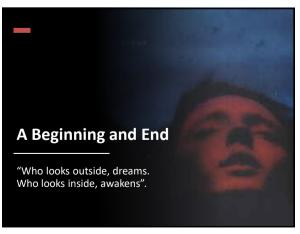

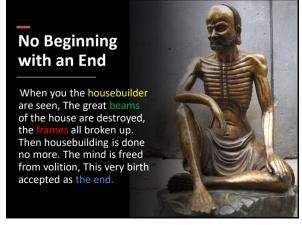
