To the Buddha, the Dharma, and the Supreme Assembly

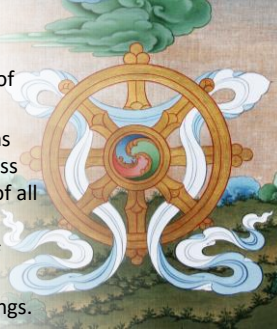
By the merits I create through listening to the Dharma, May I become a buddha to benefit all sentient beings.

I dedicate my own and other’s merits to the great enlightenment.

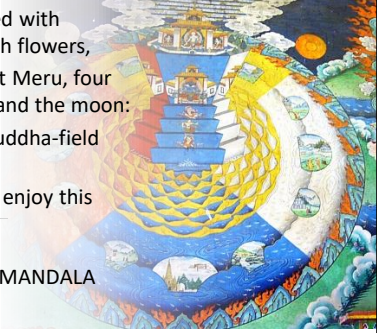





A Quote From The Abhidharma



Karma that yields happiness is virtuous karma. Karma that yields the unhappiness of suffering is non-virtuous karma. The other karma, which creates a neutral feeling, is the other, neutral karma.

Defining Virtue

A phenomenon that functions as a main cause of happiness

Defining Non-virtue

A phenomenon that functions as a main cause of suffering

Reflecting on Karma in General

1. The certainty of karma
2. The magnification of karma
3. Not experiencing the effects of actions that you did not do
4. The actions you have done do not perish

1. Karma is Definite

Happiness comes from previously created constructive actions. Suffering comes from previously created destructive ones. It never occurs the other way around

The Certainty of Karma

1. Painful feelings are the effect of previously accumulated non-virtuous karma
2. Painful feelings arise from compatible causes
3. Painful feelings do not arise from incompatible causes
4. It is impossible for painful feelings to be the effect of virtuous karmic causes
5. Painful feelings do not occur in the absence of causes
6. Understanding painful feelings and their causes is the foundation of all happiness

2. Karma Increases

A small action can produce a large effect

Changing Behaviour

- Small non-virtuous actions can produce results of great suffering
- From the original action that was the cause, effects can be greatly magnified in terms of size, amount, intensity and duration
- Because internal causation involves a magnification of effect that is larger than that found in external causation, it is important to be careful with even small infractions.

3. No Action, No Effect

You cannot experience the effect of an action without first having created its cause

No Cause – No Effect

- These pleasant results are the effects of past virtuous karma that I created
- To experience more of the same I must re-create their causes

4. Actions Do Not Go To Waste

The effect of an action will be experienced unless it is counteracted.

 <p>Karma is definite <i>If we plant cherry seeds, we can only get a cherry tree, never accidentally get chillis</i></p>	 <p>Karma is expandable <i>A seed develops into much more than just a tree: flowers, fruit, shade, wood, more trees</i></p>	 <p>No result without a cause <i>Just praying for cherries is not enough</i></p>	 <p>Karmic results are inevitable <i>Seeds lay dormant until the climate is right</i></p>

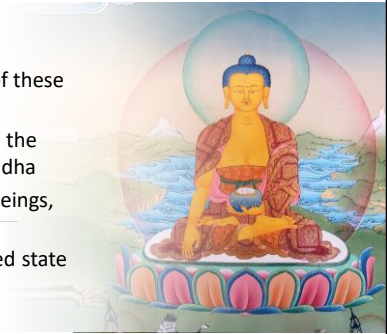
