Please, remain until the end of cyclic existence, and turn the wheel of Dharma for living beings.

I dedicate my own and other's merits to the great enlightenment.

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Mandala Offering

This ground, anointed with perfume, strewn with flowers, Adorned with Mount Meru, four continents, the sun and the moon: I imagine this as a buddha-field and offer it.

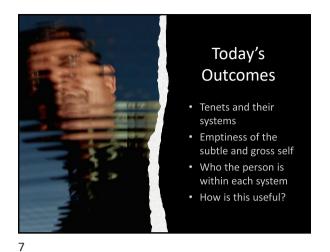

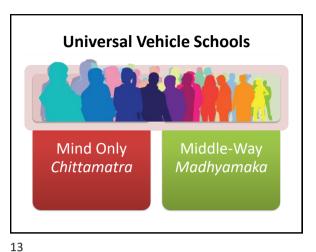
y teaching has two modes:

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Different Views of the Two Vehicles

Individual Vehicle

- View of selflessness towards the person or personal identity only
- Doesn't speak of obstructions to omniscience
- Doesn't speak of **Bodhisattva** Grounds

Universal Vehicle

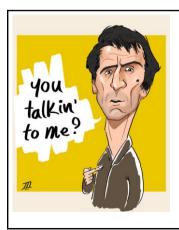
- View of selflessness as a universal principle
- Speaks of obstructions to omniscience
- Speaks of Bodhisattva Grounds which are related to ideas of the selflessness of phenomena and obstructions to omniscience

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Levels of Subtlety Unchanging, unitary, and autonomous Self-sufficient and substantial Intrinsic

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Gross Misunderstandings

- 1. I am permanent
- 2. I am independent
- 3. I am singular

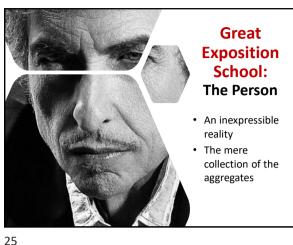
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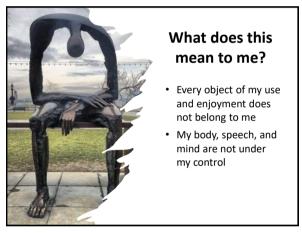
